Electronic Case Reporting Use Case

- We are in the final stages of developing a Carequality Use Case Implementation Guide for Electronic Case Reporting
- We are seeking to collect any last feedback by **EOD tomorrow**, **May 29**th. The proposed final draft is available on our website:
 - https://carequality.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/05/Electronic-Case-Reporting-Implementation-Guide-Proposed-Final-Clean-5-25-2020.pdf
- In parallel, we have made updates to the Carequality Directory to support eCR and have moved those changes into our non-prod Directory environments
- The Carequality Board has approved a long-term pricing approach for eCR, but has also waived any Implementer fees for 2020
- The Implementation Guide does permit fees to be charged, outside of declared public health emergencies, by those providing "Submission Management Services"



Queries by Public Health Agencies

- The Carequality Steering Committee adopted a Carequality Policy on queries by public health agencies: https://carequality.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/05/Carequality-Policy-on-Public-Health-Queries-During-COVID-19-Emergency-Adopted-5-7-2020.pdf
- This policy recognizes and attempts to address two barriers to rapid Carequality adoption by PHAs:
 - Many/most Carequality Implementers are not able to support queries for the "Public Health" permitted purpose, without development that will take time to complete and deploy
 - There is a lack of clarity on what constitutes the "minimum necessary" data set for public health re: COVID-19, especially relative to the broad set of information released in a "Treatment" context
- The Policy lays out a number of conditions that, if met, can allow a PHA to query for public health using the Treatment purposeOfUse code
- One of the required conditions is that the PHA have issued formal guidance around minimum necessary considerations
- It is OPTIONAL to honor these queries, and CCs representing PHAs taking advantage of this policy will be identified to all Implementers prior to their inclusion in the Directory

FHIR Workgroups - Timelines and Deliverables

- Original Timelines pre-Covid19 world
 - Deliverable I: Develop Initial Policy and Technical Questions List;
 Completed November of 2018
 - Deliverable II: Produce Implementation Guides for each workgroup (then combine into one Final Product); late Q2 2020
 - Deliverable III: FHIR Demos to Advisory Council and Steering Committee;
 early Q3 of 2020
 - Deliverable IV: Final Implementation Guide ratified as an official Carequality Element; late Q3/early Q4 of 2020
- New Timelines post-Covid19 world
 - Final Implementation Guide to be completed ASAP; targeting June 2020
 - Additional resources were deployed towards hastening these efforts
 - Cross pollination between Tech/Policy groups as we come down the home stretch
 - We have combined the 2 FHIR IGs for each WG into 1 Draft IG

 - We have resolved most of the lingering conversations/decisions during the last couple of weeks
- We also continued working through Dynamic Registration & Authentication
 Workflows during our Connectathon a couple of weeks ago
 - Specifically concentrating on using FHIR Extensions to pass PoU, Consent,
 and other metadata while signing/creating the Authentication JWT
- We're beginning the process of tying up loose ends
- We still expect to be have a completed Implementation Guide relatively soon
- Most importantly, we **DO** expect to hit our "revised goal" of June 2020

Push Notifications Workgroups

- Project overview:
 - The Policy Workgroup is close to completion of the policy section of the Push Notifications IG
 - Reactivated Discussion topics include:
 - Incorporating elements: FHIR IG
 - Notification Type/Trigger definitions
 - Defining Subscription Service specific policies
 - After integrating the conclusions of the Technical Workgroup, the IG will be evaluated as a whole
 - The Technical Workgroup continues its collaborative work
 - Determined that FHIR R4 is the best way forward with elements of R5
 - Expanding notification workflow charts
 - Defining subscription transactions
