Interoperability Matters

<u>Updates</u>

Discussion Summary: Mariann shared details about The Sequoia Project's Interoperability Matters forum. The group will function as a public-private collaborative that will focus on solving targeted, high-impact interoperability issues. The forum will serve as a platform to provide public feedback to interested regulatory bodies on interoperability issues based on real world experience. The mission, structure, and upcoming projects related to the group were discussed.

FHIR Workgroups

<u>Updates</u>

- Technical
 - Currently deliberating on whether to deploy a Carequality Centralized Authentication Server or have a Distributed Architecture
- Policy
 - Currently attempting to reach consensus on Best Practices (and possible future SLAs) on the topics of Uptime, Downtime, and Planned Downtime

Discussion Summary: Bill updated the Council on progress of ongoing projects, beginning with the FHIR Workgroups. Recent updates from the FHIR technical workgroup include a decision to deploy the version of the FHIR Capability Statement

that "Describes Software Solution Capabilities" which will give Implementers as much information as possible when attempting to interact with other endpoints. The FHIR policy workgroup has determined how a receiving system should respond to a transaction from the sending system that errors-out on their side. The FHIR technical and policy workgroup progress can be tracked on their individual websites.

IG Updates Workgroup

<u>Updates</u>

- Discussion has focused on rollout and validation of document content policy
- Next topic: Payment and Health Care Operations
- Approach to exemptions has switched to defining requirements for different categories of Implementers

Discussion Summary: Chris updated the council on the progress of the Implementation Guide Updates Workgroup. The group's discussion is currently focused on rollout and validation of the new document content policy. The next priority for the group will be to discuss the Payment and Health Care Operations permitted purposes. The council discussed the workgroup's new approach to determining which groups will be exempt from the future testing program.

Joint Document Content Workgroup

<u>Updates</u>

- The group has completed key updates to the Recommendation Document including:
 - Updates to guidance for key document sections
 - o A variety of new technical examples and diagrams
 - Honor time parameters in document queries, including recommended search parameters

Discussion Summary: The Council was updated on the progress of the Joint Document Content Workgroup. The group has completed their ad-hoc work on the recommendations document. The updates touched on a variety of issues, all of which have been reviewed and approved by the Steering Committee. The next step will be to release the new version to the public and the Implementation Guide Updates Workgroup will also evaluate and accept it as part of the Guide updates. **Decision/Outcome**: n/a

CCA Updates

<u>Updates</u>

- We have received feedback from the Implementer community on our proposed final changes
- We are making a few minor additions based on this feedback, before distributing the final version for an objection period before it goes into effect
- Once the updated text is officially accepted, it is essential that Implementers and other relevant parties (such as EHR vendors connecting their clients through CommonWell, Kno2, or Surescripts) ensure that the new terms are legally binding

Discussion Summary: Staff updated the council on the current status of the CCA updates process. There are a few minor changes made on the proposed final document based on community feedback. They were not so drastic as to require a second round of community feedback. The final version is updated; the document will be distributed to the Implementer community for a final objection period. Once the updated CCA is accepted, it is imperative that the new terms in the CCT are made legally binding. For the Implementers, this may include updating any relevant agreements with their Carequality Connections.

Push Notifications Use Case
